Key Messages


- → Potential for heavy rainfall, especially western half of southern New England
- → Risk of Flooding is decreasing
- → Potential for strong/gusty winds especially southeastern New England and adjacent coastal waters is increasing

Main Points



Hazards:

Heavy Rainfall of up to 1.5 inches and Strong Gusty Winds with gusts over 40 mph



Areas Impacted:

All of southern New England will be at risk Western portion of southern New England expected to receive the heaviest rainfall Southeast portion of southern New England expected to have the strongest winds



Timing & Duration: Late Friday into Saturday afternoon for both rain and winds



Impacts:

Winds (gusts in excess of 40 mph) \rightarrow potential minor tree damage & power outages. Rough seas and gale conditions Heavy Rain (amounts of 1 to 1.5 inches) \rightarrow nuisance ponding on roads due from clogged drains



Certainty & Considerations: Recent trends have been for an overall westward shift in the path of the storm so it passes by to our west. Heaviest rain will be near and west of the track, with stronger winds to the east of the storm track. Later forecasts for the storm may shift the path west or east, which would correspondingly change the areas at highest risk for heavy rain or gusty winds.






Peak Wind Gust Forecast






Rainfall Forecast






Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Entire area in a Marginal Risk for Excessive Rain

Lowest risk level - denotes about a 5% probability of rainfall causing flooding






Thunderstorm Outlook

Could be isolated thunderstorms Friday night into early Saturday

No severe thunderstorms are expected at this time






Marine Conditions

Gale Force winds expected to generate very rough seas

Wave heights in excess of 10 feet possible just off the coast

Rough surf, especially along south facing coastlines







Event Summary

What

- → Potential for Heavy Rainfall, though risk for flooding is decreasing
- → Potential for Strong/Gusty Winds, with risk increasing for especially southeastern New England, including the Cape and Islands
- → Rough conditions on the adjacent coastal waters

Where & When

- → All southern New England
- → Late Friday into Saturday
