### **Key Messages**


- Potential for strong/gusty winds  $\rightarrow$ especially southeastern New England and adjacent coastal waters
- Potential for heavy rainfall, especially  $\rightarrow$ western half of southern New England
- Risk of Flooding is low  $\rightarrow$

## **Main Points**



### **Hazards:**

Strong gusty winds with gusts over 40 mph, and heavy rainfall of up to 2.0 inches



### **Areas Impacted:**

All of southern New England will be at risk Southeast portion of southern New England expected to have the strongest winds Western portion of southern New England expected to receive the heaviest rainfall



Timing & Duration: Strongest impacts Friday Evening through Saturday morning for both rain and winds



### **Impacts**:

Winds (gusts in excess of 40 mph)  $\rightarrow$  potential minor tree damage and power outages. Rough seas and gale conditions Heavy Rain (amounts of 0.5 to 2.0 inches)  $\rightarrow$  nuisance ponding on roads due to leaf-clogged drains



Certainty & Considerations: Recent trends have been for an overall westward shift in the path of the storm, so it passes by to our west. Heaviest rain will be near and west of the track, with stronger winds to the east of the storm track. Later forecasts for the storm may shift the path west or east, which would correspondingly change the areas at highest risk for heavy rain or gusty winds.



# **Excessive Rainfall Outlook**

# Entire area in a Marginal Risk for Excessive Rain

Lowest risk level - denotes about a 5% probability of rainfall causing flooding





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Day 2 Issued Time: 2022-11-10 08:31:00 Valid Time: 12Z 11/11/22 - 12Z 11/12/22

Probability of excessive rainfall leading to rapid onset flooding.\*

> High Risk At least 70% Moderate Risk At least 40% Slight Risk At least 15% Marginal Risk At least 5%

\* Within 25 miles of a point. May not represent localized flooding threat over burn scars.



No severe thunderstorms are expected at this time





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
# **Marine Conditions**

Gale Force winds expected to generate very rough seas. A Gale Warning is in effect for Friday night into Saturday morning
