


- → Wind/Coastal Flood/Marine headlines now in effect

#### 7 PM Friday Weather Map









## **Hazardous Marine Conditions**






## **Maximum Wind Gust Forecast**

- Winds ramp up to 30 to 40 mph late Thursday into early Friday
- Winds peaking Friday afternoon and evening
- Strong gusts carry into early Saturday morning
- 65 MPH gusts are possible





# 5 Day Precipitation Forecast



- Precipitation expected to occur between late Thursday and early Saturday
- Primarily as rain for most of southern New England
- Perhaps ending as snow in the highest terrain (Berkshires)
- Widespread 2 to 2.5 inches with locally higher amounts

## **River Levels Outlook**




 Rain/Snowmelt across northern New England resulting in a potential for minor flooding along the Connecticut River (late Saturday through Monday)



#### Latest forecast crest is Saturday night


Dec 21 - Dec 31, 2022 Connecticut River at Northhampton, MA (NHMM3)







### Latest forecast crest is Sunday night



## **Marine Impact Timeline**

#### **Arrival of Strongest Winds:**

- Gale force (34 kt) SE winds begin 9 PM Thu 12 AM Fri
- Storm force (48 kt) SE winds begin 4 AM 7 AM Fri

#### **Peak Gusts:**

Friday morning and early afternoon (S/SE 50-60 kt)

#### **Departure of Strongest Winds:**

- Storm force (S/SW) subsides 7 PM 11 PM Fri
- Gale force (W) subsides 4 PM 10 PM Sat
- Gradually subside below 25 kt Sunday

#### Seas:


- Rapidly build early Friday morning
- Peak during the day Friday
- Subside below 10 ft nearshore Saturday afternoon/night and offshore later Sunday
- Subside below 5 ft nearshore Sunday afternoon/evening and offshore later Monday



# **Coastal Flooding Potential**





- Pockets of moderate flooding Friday morning north of Boston, Edgartown, and RI south coast (due to waves)
- Minor flooding Friday evening along South Coast threat for moderate flooding decreased
- Significant beach erosion along S/SE facing shores (southeast winds around high tide)





# Coastal Flooding Definitions

#### Minor Coastal Flooding

- Flooding up to 1 foot deep, nuisance-type flooding
- Affects the most vulnerable shore roads
- Majority of roads remain passable with only limited closures
- No significant threat to life and any impact on property is minimal.

#### **Moderate Coastal Flooding**

- Flooding 1 to 3 feet deep.
- Widespread flooding of vulnerable shore roads and basements of shore homes.
- Debris may wash onto coastal roads from breaking waves.
- Numerous road closures are typically needed.
- Some damage of vulnerable structures such as docks or house decks/porches near the high tide line due to waves.
- Risk to life for those who place themselves in unnecessary danger (driving around barricades, viewing surf from piers or jetties).





### **Key Messages**

- Powerful Storm late Thursday night into early Saturday
  - Damaging winds up to 65 mph. Power outages possible.
  - Heavy rainfall 2-2.5 inches
  - Minor to moderate coastal flooding Friday morning
  - Minor river flooding possible
- Christmas Eve Cold and windy
- Christmas Day Cold, less windy
- Coastal Flood Watch issued for all coasts
- High Wind Watch issued for eastern Massachusetts
- Hazardous marine conditions
