


A powerful storm tracking through the Great Lakes will bring a variety of weather hazards to southern New England.

7 AM Friday Weather Map









Maximum Wind Gust Forecast

- Peak wind gusts in MPH
- Strongest winds near the coast from this morning into the afternoon.





Wind Gust Timing

- Winds peak this morning into the afternoon - gusts up to 65 MPH possible
- Strong gusts of 35 to 45 MPH continue into early Saturday morning




Precipitation Forecast




- Primarily rain for most of southern New England
- Ending as a little snow this afternoon but little if any accumulation
- Widespread 1.0 to 2.5 inches of precipitation



River Flood Outlook




- Most rivers will remain within their banks
- Connecticut River at Northampton, MA could approach minor flood early Sunday morning





Marine Impact Timeline



Peak Gusts:

Through early this afternoon (S/SE 50-60 kt)

Departure of Strongest Winds:

- Storm force (S/SW) subsides 6 PM 9 PM tonight
- Gale force (W) subsides on Saturday
- Gradually subside below 25 kt Sunday


Seas:


- Rapidly build this morning, peak this afternoon
- Fall below 10 ft nearshore Saturday and offshore on Sunday
- Subside below 5 ft nearshore Sunday afternoon/evening and offshore on Monday

Light freezing spray on bays/sounds tonight into Sunday



Coastal Flooding





- Pockets of moderate flooding this morning: North of Boston, Edgartown, RI south coast (due to waves)
- Close call for moderate flooding in Providence and New Bedford (outside of barriers)
- Less of a concern this evening along South Coast splashover or minor flooding at most
- Significant beach erosion along S/SE facing shores (southeast winds around high tide)





Coastal Flooding Definitions

Minor Coastal Flooding

- Flooding up to 1 foot deep, nuisance-type flooding
- Affects the most vulnerable shore roads
- Majority of roads remain passable with only limited closures
- No significant threat to life and any impact on property is minimal.

Moderate Coastal Flooding

- Flooding 1 to 3 feet deep.
- Widespread flooding of vulnerable shore roads and basements of shore homes.
- Debris may wash onto coastal roads from breaking waves.
- Numerous road closures are typically needed.
- Some damage of vulnerable structures such as docks or house decks/porches near the high tide line due to waves.
- Risk to life for those who place themselves in unnecessary danger (driving around barricades, viewing surf from piers or jetties).

- Wind Chill Advisory for the Berkshires. May be expanded into other areas of southern New England in later forecasts.







Post Event Outlook

Bands of Snow Showers Near Cape Cod/Islands Saturday and Sunday

Narrow bands of snow showers will graze the Islands and possibly Cape Cod through the weekend.



Localized accumulations of a dusting to 2" expected. Totals will vary over short distances.



Key Messages

- Damaging winds up to 65 mph through the afternoon. Power outages possible.
- Minor to moderate coastal flooding for this morning's high tide
- Heavy rainfall may cause minor flooding
- Turning sharply colder this afternoon and evening
