- Strong to potential damaging winds across SE New England.
- Low risk for minor coastal flooding along the east and south coasts for the late Wednesday night high tide.

TIMING	 Snow develops between noon and 5 PM Wed from SW to NE. Snow changes to rain Wed evening and overnight from S to N. 		
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	 Untreated roads likely become snow-covered. The Wednesday PM commute will likely be impacted. Strong winds may result in some tree damage and power outages across SE New England. 		
NWS ALERTS	 Winter Storm Watches for Central and Western MA Wed afternoon and night Gale Watches for all MA and RI coastal waters Wed night into Fri 		
FORECAST CHALLENGES	 Timing of changeover to rain which will impact specific snow accum. Slower changeover means more snow, while quicker changeover would result in less snow.
