

OVERVIEW:

- A period of accumulating snow across much of southern New England, heaviest amounts across northern MA.
- Strong to potential damaging winds across SE New England.
- Low risk for minor coastal flooding along the east and south coasts for the late Wednesday night high tide.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Snow develops between noon and 5 PM Wed from SW to NE. ▪ Snow changes to rain Wed evening and overnight from S to N.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Untreated roads likely become snow-covered. ▪ The Wednesday PM commute will likely be impacted. ▪ Strong winds may result in some tree damage and power outages across SE New England.
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Winter Storm Watches for Central and Western MA Wed afternoon and night ▪ Gale Watches for all MA and RI coastal waters Wed night into Fri
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Timing of changeover to rain which will impact specific snow accum. ▪ Slower changeover means more snow, while quicker changeover would result in less snow.
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Drier and blustery Thu afternoon. ▪ Dry, blustery and colder Friday.
