

Decision Support Briefing #2

→ As of 4:30 AM Monday, March 13, 2023 Important Updates



- → Winter Storm Warning for NE CT, NW RI, and central/interior NE MA
- → Winter Weather Advisory for southern CT
- → High Wind Warning for E MA coast
- → Storm Warnings and Gale Warnings for the MA and RI coastal waters
- → Still have uncertainty with snow accumulations in Hartford/Springfield and Boston to Providence due to marginal temperatures (how much will stick Tuesday?)

Wind/ Damaging Wind	25-35 mph w/ gusts 50-65 mph Tree limbs/power lines/ isolated trees downed	Eastern MA	Late tonight into Wednesday morning
Snow	Snow loading on trees/power lines; morning commute (west) and evening commute (east)	Anywhere that receives 4+ inches of heavy, wet snow	Tonight (higher terrain) through Tuesday night, except Wed. AM in eastern MA
Marine	Storm conditions with 12-18 ft seas eastern MA; Gales with 5-10 ft seas RI coast	Eastern MA waters	Tonight through Wednesday
Coastal Flooding	Widespread minor coastal flooding, but pockets of moderate possible	Eastern MA from Cape Cod northward	Three high tide cycles, from 4-5 AM Tuesday through 5-6 AM Wednesday






Forecast Storm Total Snowfall


Tonight through Wednesday Morning

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
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


Coastal Flood Forecast

Graphs Showing Possible Forecast Ranges

High tide of concern is early Wednesday morning (5-6 AM). Impacts may be higher due to wave action. Expecting a 2 to 3 foot storm surge, yielding 12-13 ft MLLW in Boston Harbor and Scituate.









Summary of Greatest Impacts





Key Points Summarized

Snow

- Snow consistency will be wet. Snow loading and power outages become a big concern with totals >4". Strong winds will exacerbate the issues.
- Outside of higher terrain, temperatures will be in the mid to upper 30s around daybreak Tuesday, then they drop to 32 or lower late Tuesday morning/afternoon. That's when accumulations will really increase.
- Tuesday morning commute may be impacted in Hartford/Springfield/Worcester. The Tuesday evening commute could be difficult across much of the region, including Boston and Providence. Conditions should improve Wednesday morning.

Wind

 High confidence that wind speeds will be strongest along the eastern MA coast. Concern for downed trees/power lines and travel for high profile vehicles.

Coastal Flooding

- Minor coastal flooding is expected along the eastern MA coast from Cape Cod northward. It may last several tidal cycles Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Pockets of moderate coastal flooding possible during early morning Wednesday high tide.
