

  - **Taunton River near Bridgewater**





# **Main Points**

| Hazard              | Impacts   | Location   | Timing  |
|---------------------|---|--|---|
| Wind/ Damaging Wind | 25-35 mph w/ gusts 50-60 mph Tree limbs/power lines/ isolated trees downed Power outages likely | Eastern MA   | Peak gusts late this evening and overnight. Diminishing below 30 mph Wednesday night                                      |
| Snow                | Snow loading on trees/power lines; evening commute (east) Power outages likely                  | Anywhere that receives 4 or more inches of heavy, wet snow   | Period of moderate to heavy snow this evening across portions of eastern MA. Snow ending from west to east after midnight |
| Marine              | Storm conditions with 20-25 ft seas eastern MA; Gales with 5-10 ft seas RI coast                | Eastern MA waters  | Through Wednesday   |
| Coastal Flooding    | Widespread minor coastal flooding   | Eastern Massachusetts,<br>Martha's Vineyard and<br>Nantucket | Next two high tide cycles, but especially the early Wednesday morning high tide.  |






## **Additional Forecast Snowfall**

Period of moderate to heavy snow across northeast MA through early evening


Snow should taper off quickly after midnight from west to east





# **Precipitation Type - 4 PM**


Quick changeover across southeast New England





# **Precipitation Type - 6 PM**


**Snow Expected Region Wide by 6 PM Today** 





# **Precipitation Type - 8 PM**


Snow Area Wide, Heaviest across northeast MA





# **Precipitation Type - 2 AM**


Snow ending across western areas - Light intensity for eastern areas






# **Precipitation Type - 6 AM**

No significant precipitation expected






# Forecast Wind Gusts Through Tonight

Continued gusty winds in areas where trees remain snow loaded may result in additional tree damage/power outages


Wind Gusts drop below 30-35 mph late Wednesday




## **Coastal Flood Forecast**

#### **East Coastal Areas**

High tide of concern is early Wednesday morning (5-6 AM). Impacts may be higher due to wave action. Expecting a 2 to 3 foot storm surge, yielding 11-12 ft MLLW in Boston Harbor and at Scituate.








## **Coastal Flood Forecast**

#### **Nantucket**




High tide of concern is early Wednesday morning, with the early Thursday morning high tide perhaps also seeing issues.

Surge is expected to be around 2 ft




# Minor River Flooding

### Taunton River (MA), Wood River (RI) and Pawtuxet River (RI)

In minor flood
Crest Wednesday evening

Wood @ Hope Valley
Reach flood stage this evening
Crest after midnight

Taunton @ Bridgewater Reach flood state Wed morning Crest early Thursday



# **Key Points Summarized**

#### Snow

- Snow loading and power outages remain a big concern in areas with more than 4" of accumulation. Strong winds developing late afternoon and this evening will exacerbate the issues.
- Evening commute likely to be difficult across much of the region, including Boston, Hartford and Providence.
- Snow ending after midnight.

#### Wind

- High confidence in winds in excess of 40 mph along the eastern MA coast, with the highest gusts across NE Essex County where winds will exceed 50-60 mph through Tuesday evening. Concern for downed trees/power lines.
- Wednesday will have continued wind gusts 35 mph up to 45 mph in some spots. May result in additional tree damage/power outages

### Coastal Flooding

 Minor coastal flooding is expected along the eastern MA coast and at Nantucket again early Wednesday with high tide. Potential minor flooding for Nantucket with Thursday morning's high tide

### River Flooding

 Minor flooding expected along parts of the Taunton River in MA and Pawtuxet and Wood Rivers in RI. Crests will be tomorrow through Thursday.
