

Potential Snow Squalls Overnight



OVERVIEW:

- An approaching strong cold front may have the potential to produce briefly moderate to heavy snow, falling temps & icy roads
- Highest confidence are for areas across western Massachusetts

TIMING	▪ Late Wednesday night through early hours of Thursday	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ A strong cold front will bring the possibility of snow squalls late this evening into the early hours of Thursday.▪ Snow squall may produce briefly heavy snow with falling temperatures.▪ Minor snow accumulation on roadways are possible in western Massachusetts, which may lead to icy road conditions.	
NWS ALERTS	▪ None at this time. In the event of a snow squall a short-fused snow squall warning may be issued to alert motorist.	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	▪ How far east the squall line travels before diminishing. Currently, the greatest confidence is for areas of western Massachusetts.
