OVERVIEW:

- A strong cold front will bring initial rain to a brief period of moderate to heavy snow with low visibility.
- Highest confidence are for areas across western MA.

TIMING	▪ Greatest risk 9-11 PM for western MA/CT, 11 PM - 1 AM central MA/western RI/eastern CT, midnight to 3 AM eastern MA/RI.	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Reduced visibility as rain changes to a short-lived (half-hour in any one location) period of moderate to heavy snow.▪ Slippery untreated roads from coatings to up to one inch of new snow.	
NWS ALERTS	▪ None at this time. In the event of a snow squall a short-fused snow squall warning may be issued to alert motorist.	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	▪ How far east the squall line travels before diminishing. Currently, the greatest confidence is for areas of western MA.
