

OVERVIEW:

- Line of showers and thunderstorms expected to move into southern New England from the west Saturday evening.
- Thunderstorms have the potential to become strong to severe with the greatest threat across western Massachusetts and Connecticut.
- Primary risk from these storms are damaging wind gusts.

TIMING	 Saturday: 7 PM to 9 PM - Western Massachusetts & Connecticut Saturday: 9 PM to 11 PM - Eastern Massachusetts & Rhode Island
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	 Localized strong to damaging wind gusts are possible, which could cause isolated tree damage. Hail is a secondary risk and there is also a low risk for an isolated tornado. All of southern New England is at risk for severe thunderstorms, but the highest risk is across western Massachusetts and Connecticut.
NWS ALERTS	 SPC has maintained a Slight Risk of Severe Weather across the interior.
FORECAST CHALLENGES	 The amount of sunshine Saturday afternoon which will determine magnitude of instability. Will the threat of severe thunderstorms extend into eastern Massachusetts and Rhode Island?
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	 Blustery and colder Sunday with highs in the mid/upper 40s. NVV winds 20-30 mph.
