OVERVIEW

- A Few Strong to Severe Thunderstorms Possible Monday PM.
- Localized Damaging Wind Gusts Possible.
- Torrential rainfall may result in a very localized flood threat.
- Dangerous cloud to ground lightning possible.

TIMING

- A few severe t-storms possible Mon between 2 & 11 pm.
- Mainly northwest of the Boston-Providence corridor.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Localized damaging wind gusts possible.
- Torrential rain with a few storms may result in street flooding.
- Dangerous Cloud to Ground Lightning.

NWS ALERTS

- None at this time

FORECAST CHALLENGES

- **What we know** - there will be scattered thunderstorms Monday afternoon and evening with cloud to ground lightning.
- **What we don't know** - Whether storms produce sub-severe wind gusts of 30-40 mph or 50-60 mph gusts which would result in localized damage.

POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

- Scattered thunderstorms are expected again on Independence Day...particularly during the afternoon and evening hours.
- Torrential rain, gusty winds, and frequent lightning possible with the strongest storms on Independence Day.

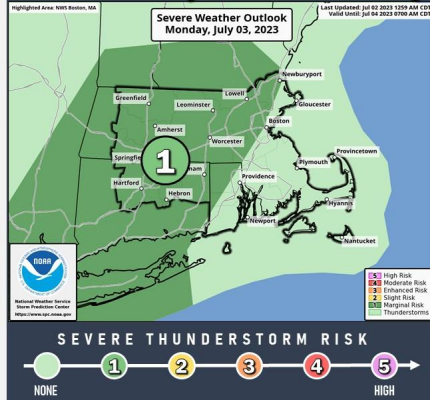


DAMAGING WIND

What To Expect

- Main risk for a few severe t-storms Monday afternoon 2 pm until 11 pm.
- Dangerous cloud to ground lightning.
- Torrential Rain/Localized Street flooding.

What To Do?

- Stay Weather Aware!
- Check back should the forecast change
- Be ready to take shelter indoors when storms approach
- Have multiple ways to receive warnings
