

# Possible Flooding Tonight & Sun

## OVERVIEW:

- Showers and t-storms resume late tonight and overnight. Localized flooding is possible under persistent downpours.
- Less shower/storm chances Saturday, but Sunday will again feature widespread rain & t-storms which may cause flash flooding.

### TIMING

- Rain and t-storms resume later tonight and overnight.
- A potentially more significant round of heavy rains Sunday & Sunday night.

### HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Areas which see persistent heavy rains may see urban, street and basement flooding, as well as rapid rises on rivers, creeks and streams.
- Considerable, significant flooding may result in inundation in homes and businesses with road washouts also possible.

### NWS ALERTS

- Flood Watch for northern CT, all of RI, and western, central, and part of southeast MA until 12:00 AM Saturday.
- Flood Watch **may be needed** Sunday and/or Sunday night.

### FORECAST CHALLENGES

- Areal coverage of the heaviest downpours and flooding concerns.
- Risk for wind damage from t-storms: saturated ground may make trees more vulnerable to fall from t-storm wind gusts.

### POST-EVENT OUTLOOK

- Mainly dry for Monday.
- Another chance for showers/t-storms Tuesday but less coverage.

**Flash Flood Watch**  
*In effect through midnight*

- Scattered t-storms capable of heavy rain re-develop late this afternoon through tonight. Combined with saturated ground, street and poor drainage flooding will again be possible.
- Up to a half-inch of new rain is anticipated, though up to 2 inches of rain are possible in localized spots underneath persistent t-storms.
