


Key Messages

- Dangerous heat today through Saturday
 - Heat Advisory remains in effect into late Saturday for much of the region.
- Strong Rip Currents across south facing beaches today
- Strong to severe thunderstorms possible on Saturday
 - Timing estimate 12-9 PM, but activity could develop earlier.
 - Locations: Possible anywhere, but better chances from the Mass Pike southward.
 - Damaging straight line winds are the most likely hazard.
 - Heavy downpours and recent rains may lead to localized flash flooding.
 - There is also a risk for large hail and a tornado or two.



Max Heat Index Today - Saturday








Heat Advisory Today - Saturday


Max Heat Indices of 95-104 F

South facing beaches have the greatest risk






Severe Weather Outlook Saturday

Severe Wind Probability 5-29% Chance









Large Hail and Tornado Risk Saturday

Key Messages

- Dangerous heat through Saturday
- Strong Rip Currents across south facing beaches today
- Strong to severe thunderstorms possible on Saturday
 - A best timing estimate is 12-9 PM but may develop sooner.
 - Area of greatest severe weather risk is south of the Mass Pike, but some risk exists everywhere.
 - Damaging straight line winds are the most likely hazard.
 - Heavy downpours and recent rains may lead to localized flash flooding.
 - There is also a risk for large hail and a tornado or two.
