What has changed:

 Tropical Storm Warning now in effect for the entire Massachusetts coastline, including Cape and Islands



Situation Overview

Hurricane Lee


- Hurricane Lee will bring wind, rain and coastal flood impacts to eastern Massachusetts Friday night into Saturday, especially Cape Cod and the Islands.
- Wind Increasing north winds expected Friday night with the peak of the wind after midnight into Saturday afternoon. Strongest winds will impact the Cape and Islands with 50-60 mph gusts likely. For the remainder of eastern MA, 40 to 50 mph gusts likely.

- Storm Surge/Coastal Flooding The most significant coastal flooding is expected to impact the northern shoreline of Cape Cod (bay side) and Nantucket around the early morning high tide Saturday. Areas of minor flooding is also possible along east coastal MA during this high tide.
- Rainfall Heaviest rainfall will occur late Friday night into Saturday, primarily focused across the Cape and Islands where 1 to 3 inches of rain is possible.



NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track.

Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

- Tropical Storm Warnings in effect for the entire MA coastline, including Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard and the adjacent coastal waters
- Hurricane Lee has a large wind field with wind impacts well to the west of the track
- Coastal Flood Warning in effect for Cape Cod and Nantucket
- High Surf Advisories for the entire
 MA & RI coastline


There is a potential for:

- Gusty winds causing some tree limbs or trees to be downed in the area highlighted in yellow
- Potential power outages
- Outer Cape has the highest potential to see gusts to 60 mph




 The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for coastal southern New England will be Friday afternoon.

Hurricane Lee




 The most likely time of arrival of tropical storm force winds will be Friday night/early Saturday



Key Take-Aways

Hurricane Lee

- Hurricane Lee will bring wind, rain and coastal flood impacts to eastern
 Massachusetts Friday night into Saturday
- The strongest winds and heaviest rainfall will impact the Cape and Islands
- Minor to moderate coastal flooding is expected for Cape Cod (bay side) and Nantucket sound & harbor.



We have moderate confidence in wind and rain impacts, but lower confidence in coastal flood impacts as this will depend on the timing of peak storm surge occurring around high tide
