


OVERVIEW:

- 1 to 4 inches of snow are expected across the high elevations of the Berkshires and Worcester Hills Tuesday night, before changing to rain.
- Strong winds Wednesday, mainly along the southeast coast

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Snow Tuesday night▪ Strong winds Wednesday morning	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ A period of snow will lead to accumulations of 1 to 4 inches before changing to rain▪ Wind gusts of 30-50 mph toward the coast▪ Greatest risk across Cape Cod and the islands.	
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Gale Watch for all waters Tuesday night and Wednesday.	
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Marginal temperatures and uncertainty on the track of the storm lead to uncertainty as to how much snow accumulates before being washed away by rain.▪ Whether the strongest wind gusts (50+mph) materialize over Cape Cod
