



## OVERVIEW:

- Rapidly strengthening low pressure will bring a brief period of heavy rain to Rhode Island and SE Massachusetts
- Strong winds, up to 50-55 mph, expected across Cape Cod and the Islands

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Rain beginning after 8 PM with heaviest rain between 2 AM and 6 AM</li> <li>▪ Strongest winds to occur between 1 AM and 7 AM Monday</li> </ul>	
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Up to 2" of rain is possible in a three to six hour period early Monday, potentially leading to urban and poor drainage flooding</li> <li>▪ Strong wind gusts around 50 mph may cause power outages &amp; tree damage</li> <li>▪ Minor splash over is possible in Narragansett Bay around the AM high tide</li> </ul>	
<b>NWS ALERTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ A Wind Advisory is in place for Cape Cod and the Islands 1-7AM Monday</li> <li>▪ A Coastal Flood Statement is in effect for Narragansett Bay surrounding the AM high tide</li> <li>▪ Gale Warnings are in place for most of the waters</li> </ul>	
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The position and timing of the low pressure system. Minor shifts in the timing of the system could eliminate the threat for coastal flooding. Minor deviations in the strength and position of the low could shift the axis of heaviest precipitation and strongest winds.</li> </ul>	
<b>POST-EVENT OUTLOOK</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Conditions improve rapidly after 7AM Monday</li> <li>▪ Dry and below normal temperatures on tap for Tuesday and Wednesday</li> </ul>
