December 17-18 Storm



OVERVIEW:

Increasing probability for an impactful storm that will affect southern New England with strong, gusty winds and moderate to heavy rainfall. Coastal flooding along south facing coasts may also occur.

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Sunday night through Monday

HAZARDS &

IMPACTS

MA, Cape & Islands. Could result in downed trees Locally heavy rainfall. Potential for river rises. Minor ponding of water on roads.

Potential for strong wind gusts 45 to 60 mph primarily across RI, southeast

- Water levels along south facing coastal areas, including Narragansett Bay could run up to 3 ft above normal. If this coincides with the Monday afternoon high tide, moderate coastal flooding could occur.

NWS ALERTS

None at this time.

FORECAST CHALLENGES

• Still uncertainty with exact timing and intensity of the storm, and that directly affects trying to determine level of impacts.


