Important Updates


Expected Rainfall Forecast



- Rain begins Tonight.
- Heaviest rains overnight into early Saturday AM.
 Areal/urban flooding and renewed rises to be most focused in this time period.
- Rains decrease late
 Saturday morning,
 although river rises likely to
 continue after rain ends.

Pawtuxet River, Wood River, Pawcatuck River Shawsheen River, Charles River, Farmington River, Housatonic River

Quicker responding rivers reaching flood stage Saturday. Slower ones Sunday

Uncertainty until rainfall and snowmelt






Pawtuxet River at Cranston

Pawtuxet River at Cranston, RI (CRAR1)



Shawsheen River at Andover


Jan 12 - Jan 22, 2024 Shawsheen River at Andover, MA (ANDM3)



Time and Day (EST)

- Shawsheen River at Andover is expected to continue to rise in minor flood cresting near 31 feet on Saturday (minor).

Maximum Wind Gust Forecast



- Strongest wind gusts generally
 2 AM through 9 AM Saturday.
 - Will come from a southeasterly direction, with gusts of 45 to 60 mph.
 Strongest from I-95 corridor onto the Cape & Islands.
 - Power Outages & Downed trees are possible.
- Westerly wind gusts 30-45 mph Rest of Saturday through Sunday.

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

- Gusty W to SW winds through late Saturday and Sunday (30-45 mph)






Forecast Wave Heights





Coastal Flooding



Moderate coastal flooding expected along both southern and eastern coasts. The high tide of concern is between 8 AM and 2 PM Saturday.

- Especially south coastal MA/RI and portions of Martha's Vineyard
- Storm surge of 2 to 4 feet expected.
- Could be very similar to the midweek event.

Greatest coastal flooding impacts on upper end of Narragansett Bay including Providence, South Coastal Massachusetts and the North Shore of Massachusetts.
