





Strongest winds expected to occur mid-day Wednesday through mid-day


Potential to cause power outages, especially if wet snow accumulates on










Strong Wind Gusts


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

Coastal Flooding Potential

- Concern for minor to moderate coastal flooding around time of the Thursday morning high tide
- Beach erosion due to wave action along the eastern MA coastline, especially northeast MA
- Still uncertainty in the amount of storm surge and if it lines up with the time of high tide
