



OVERVIEW:

- Strong to locally Severe Storms this Afternoon with the greatest threat being Damaging Winds
- Heavy Rain in Thunderstorms may result in localized Urban and Flash Flooding
- Greatest Storm Coverage west of the I-495 corridor including CT, RI and Central and Western MA

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| TIMING | ▪ Friday Afternoon; between 1 PM and 8 PM | |
| HAZARDS & IMPACTS | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Damaging Winds▪ Rainfall rates of over 1" per hour and slow moving thunderstorms may result in Urban/Poor Drainage and Flash Flooding▪ Storm total rainfall may reach 3" with locally higher amounts possible if storms remain stationary | |
| NWS ALERTS | <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ There are currently no convective headlines in effect▪ A Heat Advisory remains in effect for the southern CT River Valley through 7pm | |
| FORECAST CHALLENGES | ▪ Location of a back-door cold front which will influence where heavy rain and the strongest storms develop | |
