- Heavy Rain in Thunderstorms may result in localized Urban and Flash Flooding
- Greatest Storm Coverage across CT, RI and central and western MA

| NWS ALERTS             | <ul> <li>There are currently no convective headlines in effect</li> <li>A Heat Advisory remains in effect for CT &amp; southwest MA, including the Greater Springfield area, for heat indices into the mid 90s.</li> </ul>   |
| FORECAST<br>CHALLENGES | <ul> <li>Areal coverage and severity of thunderstorms.</li> </ul>  |
