Next Scheduled Briefing: By 6 PM Saturday February 8

Key Messages

- A moderate snowfall event is expected tonight into Sunday morning.
- Potential for some light freezing rain in parts of the area
 Sunday morning into midday as the storm winds down.
- Expect difficult travel conditions.

Important Updates

- → Winter Storm Warnings issued for parts of southern New England where confidence is highest in forecast snowfall amounts.
- Winter Weather Advisories issued for the Cape and islands







Winter Weather Headlines



Saturday Evening Through Sunday Afternoon



- → Winter Storm Warning for most of southern New England
- → Winter Weather Advisory for the Cape and islands



- → Widespread snowfall amounts of 4 to 9" in the warning area
- → Snowfall of 2-6" within the advisory area
- → Light glaze of ice possible Sunday morning



→ Difficult travel conditions are expected





Confidence Levels

Snow begins this evening. Moderate to heavy snowfall rates, perhaps up to 1" per hour tonight. Snow ends from west to east late tonight into mid-morning Sunday. A few showers could linger into early afternoon allong the east coast of MA.

Still expecting moderate to heavy snowfall tonight. However, uncertainty remains with any freezing drizzle or light rain Sunday morning which will impact final amounts.






Travel will be difficult, especially late this evening into the pre-dawn hours Sunday when snowfall accumulation rates will be highest.






Chance of Different Snow Amounts

Ω What To Do:


- Drive with caution and as the road conditions dictate


Snowfall Onset Timing



 Snowfall intensity will quickly become moderate to heavy shortly after starting



Snowfall End Timing



- Heaviest snow ends before dawn, light snow continues into Sunday morning
- Light freezing drizzle is expected to mix with light snow during the morning hours into the early afternoon in many areas, and light rain closer to the coast.
