
Key Messages

- Snow develops into mid evening & continues overnight before changing to ice/rain by early-mid morning Sunday.
- Mainly rain across eastern MA/RI by mid-late Sun AM with street flooding possible.
- In the interior a period of sleet followed by freezing rain especially across the Worcester Hills/Berkshires where power outages are possible into Sun night as winds increase.

New Information

- Upgraded Winter Weather Advisories to Winter Storm \rightarrow Warnings across northern MA as well as the Worcester Hills and Berkshires.
- A Storm Watch has been issued for all our Marine Waters \rightarrow Sunday night and Monday
- A High Wind Watch remains in effect for all of southern New \rightarrow England.





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Winter Weather Headlines



Tonight into Sunday

→ All of southern New England except Cape Cod and the Islands



- → Widespread snowfall amounts of 3-7" with the highest of those amounts north of I-90.
- Snow changing to ice/rain by early to mid morning Sunday.

Snow begins through 6 pm western MA/CT and 7-9 PM east of Worcester. Snow changing to ice/rain south to north between 2 and 8 am. Gradual change over to all rain by Sunday afternoon except for the Worcester Hills & Berkshires where freezing rain may continue.



Travel will be difficult, especially later tonight into the pre-dawn hours Sunday when snowfall accumulation rates will be highest.

Snow Accumulations Tonight Into Early Sunday Morning





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


Expected Ice Accumulation

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Snowfall Onset Timing



- Briefly light snowfall at the onset of 1" per hour or greater.
 - Ο west to east.
- Roadways will quickly become snow covered, leading to difficult driving conditions.



- 12-2 AM: CT
- 1-3 AM : RI/southeast MA/Cape
- 4-7 AM: west, central, eastern MA Wintry mix changing to rain for most of southern New England between 7AM-12PM Sunday



- Sustained W winds of 25-35 MPH.
- Peak gusts 45 to 65 MPH.
- **Tree Damage & Power Outages** possible.
- Lingering ice and snow on trees and powerlines may exacerbate power outage potential with high winds.



- A Storm Watch is in Effect Sunday night and Monday.
 - Westerly wind gusts of 45-55 knots with seas as high as 15-20 south of the Outer-Islands
 - Areas of moderate freezing spray expected by Monday night into Tuesday.
