



OVERVIEW:

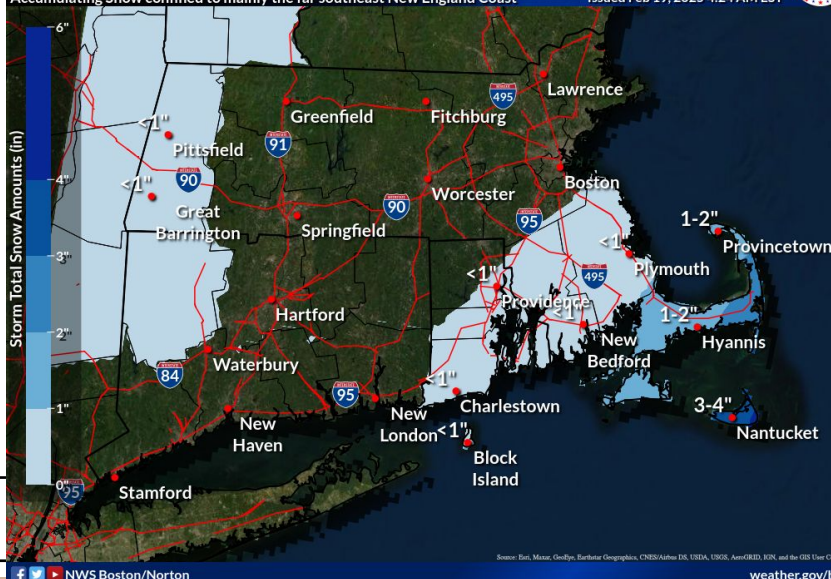
- Snow Develops across the Cape/Islands late Thu morning/afternoon.
- Periods of snow continue across the Cape/Islands Thu night.
- 1-3" of snow for the Cape/Marthas Vineyard & 2-5 for Nantucket.
- The snow shield does not get much further northwest than the Cape Cod Canal, perhaps grazing Plymouth county onto the south coast.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Snow develops across the Cape/Islands late Thu morning/afternoon. ▪ Periods of snow continue Thu night before ending by early Fri morning.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 1-3" of snow for the Cape/Marthas Vineyard & 2-5" for Nantucket. ▪ Roads may become snow covered and slippery by Thu afternoon/early evening across the Cape and Islands.
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Winter Weather Advisory In Effect for Nantucket ▪ There is the potential the Winter Weather Advisory may need to be expanded onto the Cape and Marthas Vineyard in later forecasts.
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Uncertainty on the northwest extent of the snow shield. ▪ The snowfall amounts may need to be increased/decreased and shifted a bit northwest/southeast depending on the exact track of the system.
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Partly to mostly sunny Fri and it will be breezy. Highs upper 20s to the middle 30s
