OVERVIEW:

- Scattered severe thunderstorms possible today NW of I-95.
- Main severe weather threat is locally damaging straight line wind gusts with a secondary concern for hail.
- Heavy rain/Urban Street flooding is also possible.
- Greatest severe weather risk is in northern CT and interior MA.

FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Areal coverage of the severe weather potential and how close to the I-95 the activity is able to get before weakening.▪ Do not expect t-storms to survive southeast of I-95.
