



OVERVIEW:

- A round of strong to potentially severe storms is expected to move through southern New England around Saturday afternoon and evening.
- The main threats are damaging winds and large hail, but a tornado can't be ruled out in western MA/CT.

TIMING	▪ Noon to 9 PM.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	▪ Winds capable of downing trees and powerlines and possible damage to structures.
NWS ALERTS	▪ None at this time.
