


# Isolated Severe Weather Possible

## OVERVIEW:

- Isolated severe t-storms possible between 3 & 10 pm this evening, but not expecting a widespread/significant severe weather outbreak.
- The greatest threat is frequent lightning and isolated damaging winds gusts.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ 3 PM to 10 PM this evening.</li></ul>
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Localized Downed trees and/or power lines from straight line winds</li></ul>
<b>NWS ALERTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ None at this time.</li></ul>
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Areal coverage of the thunderstorms and if a few are able to become severe and produce isolated damaging wind gusts.</li></ul>
