



OVERVIEW:

- Strong to severe storms are possible across interior southern New England this afternoon and evening.
- Primary hazards include damaging winds, localized flash flooding and a even a tornado.
- Greatest risk is in western/central MA and western CT, with storms expected to weaken as they move into RI and eastern MA Saturday night.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Thunderstorms develop as early as 12-2pm along the New York border.▪ Strongest storms developing 2-7pm across interior southern New England.▪ Weakening thunderstorms move towards the Boston/Providence corridor between 7-10pm.	
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Straight-line damaging winds, strong enough to down trees and power lines, with potential structural damage.▪ Low risk of a tornado or two.▪ Localized flash flooding.▪ Hail & frequent lightning.
