

## Freezing Rain Tonight - Monday



## WEATHER FORECAST OFFICE

## OVERVIEW:

- Low pressure passing west of Southern New England will bring a period of freezing rain tonight into the early part of Monday.
- A light glaze of ice for locations along I-95, but more significant icing is possible (up to a quarter-inch) in interior Southern New England where colder surface air will take longer to warm.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Developing west to east from 7-10 PM tonight, changing to rain from south to north between 12-6 AM Monday morning.</li> </ul>
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Difficult travel, especially overnight to Monday morning commute, due to icy roads and sidewalks.</li> <li>Downed trees, powerlines &amp; icy roads/sidewalks in upper CT &amp; Merrimack Valleys where more significant icing is possible.</li> </ul>
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Winter Weather Advisory for all of Southern New England except southeast coastal New England from 7 PM tonight to 6 AM Monday.</li> </ul>
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>How long will it take for surface temps in interior valleys to rise above freezing.</li> <li>Brief slippery spots possible for the south coast as plain rain initially falls on cold pavement.</li> </ul>
POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Rain with temps near 50F Monday.</li> <li>Strong winds and frigid temperatures Monday night to Tuesday.</li> </ul>
