

Snowfall Late Tonight - Sat. Evening



OVERVIEW:

- Snow overspreads the region west to east overnight, continuing through Saturday afternoon before tapering west to east; lingering snow showers possible Saturday evening across far eastern Massachusetts.
- Snowfall totals of 2–4 inches region-wide, increasing to 3–5 inches along the I-95 corridor, with isolated 6+ inch amounts possible in northeast Massachusetts.

TIMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Light snow begins around midnight, becoming steadier predawn. Heaviest snowfall occurs late morning through the afternoon, with accumulating snow ending early evening. Lingering snow possible across the Outer Cape and Islands into predawn Sunday.
HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Snow covered roads will lead to slippery road conditions. ▪ Brief bursts of heavier snow will lead to reduced visibility on the roads.
NWS ALERTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Winter Storm Watch in effect for Essex County, Massachusetts. ▪ Winter Weather Advisory in effect for central and eastern Massachusetts, and Rhode Island.
FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Where heavier snow bands set up, bringing the potential for localized totals up to 8 inches. Watch depicts the most likely area right now.
POSTEVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Very cold and blustery through the day on Sunday. ▪ Less wind Sunday night but temperatures falling below zero in many locations away from the coast.
