



## OVERVIEW:

- Weak clipper system will bring a minor accumulating snow to most of Southern New England late today into early Wednesday morning, mixing with rain along the south coast.
- Coatings to 2 inches of snow for most, though totals in the 2-4 inch range for northern/northeast MA. Snow may end as a brief period of freezing drizzle for parts of CT and western MA.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Light snowflakes break out 3-6 PM west-to-east, with the main period of accumulating snow during the evening (approx. 7 PM–2 AM). Ends pre-dawn Wednesday morning.</li> </ul>
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Snow-covered and slippery roads, especially in northeast MA from snow and western MA/northern CT due to mix of snow &amp; light icing.</li> </ul>
<b>NWS ALERTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Winter Weather Advisories for northern MA, and for western MA and western/central CT (light snow &amp; light icing) from 6 PM to 6 AM Wed.</li> </ul>
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Coverage of freezing drizzle.</li> <li>▪ Snowfall rates no more than 0.5" per hour could limit impacts.</li> </ul>
<b>POST-EVENT OUTLOOK</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Dry weather with temps in the upper 30s Wed after snow ends.</li> </ul>
<b>NEXT BRIEFING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Final briefing (unless significant changes).</li> </ul>
